



# 10 REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD BRING STUDENTS TO THIS YEAR'S SLC

## **REASON #1: WHAT FACES THE BELIEVER (our students) TODAY:**

1. We live in a world of OPPOSING VALUES!
2. We live in a world with an AGGRESSIVE STRATEGY!
3. We either ADOPT OR REJECT those values!
4. IN ORDER TO REJECT THOSE VALUES WE MUST BE EQUALLY AGGRESSIVE WITH GOD'S PLAN!

**REASON #2:** SLC is committed to come alongside your ministry in “helping good kids become godly servants”. There will be a combination of challenging sessions, key discussion times, great fellowship with students from other ministries with similar goals, all with the purpose of HELPING YOUR STUDENTS IN HAVING A BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW AND DEVELOPING A MINISTRY MINDSET.

**REASON #3:** I definitely learned the importance of good, godly influence. We know we as older kids have much influence on those younger and even our peers. We need to set a godly example and to do what we need to be in God's Word all the time and praying consistently. Another thing I learned is the power of speech. **REASON #4:** God taught me that making a difference at school must start with your personal life/relationship with God. And so many people at school want to do right and take a stand, but no one is willing to execute—it takes ONE person who really loves God, to make a school wide “cultural change”. And it is contagious....not among everyone, but I gotta be willing to give up “being liked: by everyone and have my friends make a choice. Also, I've seen how selfish I've been; life's about God, not me. *Student*

**REASON #5:** God showed me areas that my students are struggling in. My stand can impact them to stand. They want to but it is easy to look away. I was convicted to always say something when I see something. *Sponsor*

**REASON #6:** I learned that I don't just need to try my hardest to be a leader. It's something that God puts in those who follow Him. I've realized that I need to follow Jesus Christ with all my heart and be an example to those around me. I'd let God take over and do the rest. I want to be a help to those who are younger and look up to me. I want them to grow stronger in Christ because of my influence. *Student*

**REASON #7:** He taught me to not go with the crowd if they are doing or talking about wrong stuff but to stand up for what is right. To live by God's principles. To be approachable to younger students. That I leave a Godly legacy and to be Christ-like in everything I do! *Student*

**REASON #8:** The Lord has taught me to speak up when I see or am a part of something that shouldn't be happening and/or not glorifying to God. He also has laid on my heart to serve Him with all that I have and not just a one foot in one foot out type of relationship. And to lead in a way that shows that I am different from other non-believers. *Student*
